1. About MAINS (The Master of Arts in Inter-Asia NGO Studies)

The Master of Arts in Inter-Asia NGO Studies program began in 2007. Its unique multidisciplinary curriculum, combined with practical training, focuses on social change, non-governmental organizations, and civil society in Asia. The curriculum covers current regional and global issues, with a special emphasis on fostering solidarity among civil society participants.

The MAINS program is designed for individuals who have already made or have the potential to make significant contributions to the development of civil society in Asia. SungKongHoe University provides academic and practical resources to offer intensive and flexible preparation for those seeking leadership and skills to promote more just and equitable social changes in Asia. The MAINS program has evolved over the years to place greater emphasis on the experience of democratization and development in Korea and the Asian context.





2. ADMISSION

1) Eligibility

We welcome applicants with an undergraduate degree, preferably in social science fields, and experience in the non-profit or non-governmental sectors in Asia and Korea.

Applicants from outside the Asian region will not receive priority consideration for admission due to the nature of the program. We seek individuals who are sensitive to and involved in issues such as promoting social change, environmental justice, human rights, democratization, community development, cross-border solidarity, citizenship, and humanitarian aid in Asia. These points will be closely scrutinized during the admission decision process. Therefore, we do not encourage applications with the sole purpose of career advancement in the NGO sector.

4) Admission Requirements

- Applicants who have a bachelor's or higher degree, or have university graduate equivalency approved by an authorized organization.
- Official English language ability test result within 2 years.

(The minimum requirement for any of the following : TOEFL 530, CBT 197, iBT 71, IELTS 5.5, CEFR B2, TEPS 600, New TEPS 326)

According to Ministry of Education regulations, applicants with degrees higher than a university degree from countries where English is the native or official language may be exempt from submitting official English test results. However, even if you meet this requirement, the admissions office recommends submitting your official English test results in advance. The admissions committee may require submission of official English test results based on the video interview.

If successful applicants fail to submit their official English test results within the given period, the admissions committee will cancel their acceptance.

5) Evaluation

- Procedure: Documents Screening and Online Video Interview
 (Applicants who are deemed unsuitable for this program through document screening will not be interviewed)
- Method: The Admission committee will review and decide who will be offered admission and scholarship based on document and interview evaluation score.

3. CURRICULUM

1) Course Nature

The MAINS is an English-taught alternative social studies program that focuses on Asian civil society. The program encourages applications from individuals with working experience in Asian non-governmental organizations, particularly from Asia and Korea. MAINS offers an advanced and intensive program that utilizes teaching methods based on individual self-research, mutual learning among students, and thematic approaches. Reading, writing, debating, and interacting with other students are strongly emphasized.

2) Course Structure

The MAINS program is an 18-month, 4-quarter program that includes 6 months of field work and thesis writing. It consists of core courses, elective courses, and a thesis, totaling 24 credits. Each quarter has a particular theme that serves as a synthesizing structure. Class schedules run from one quarter to the next with a week's break in between. Quarters have a varied number of sessions. Some courses may be taught intensively by visiting lecturers. Courses combine lectures and student-led seminars.

4. THESIS

All students must write a thesis or equivalent research report on topics related to social change and the non-profit or governmental sectors, with a special focus on democracy, development, or civil society in Asia. It is strongly recommended that applicants emphasize their own country's context. This point will be given special attention during the application evaluation process. The choice of topic outlined above will be the primary consideration throughout the entire admission process. In the third quarter, students should be able to defend their thesis or report proposal by writing the first chapter. The fourth and final quarter is dedicated to completing the thesis or report, which includes fieldwork, data collection, writing, and submitting the final version.

5. TUITION, SCHOLARSHIP & OTHER EXPENSES

Qualified students may receive full or partial scholarships, with priority given to those from developing countries in Asia.

The scholarship covers tuition fees and living expenses. The level of scholarship awarded to each student is determined based on their academic aptitude, grades, needs, and individual circumstances. The scholarship for tuition and living expenses is only available to students who reside in Korea for the entire first three terms. If a student takes time off during the course or falls behind the school's academic regulations, the scholarship may be

invalidated.

The scholarship for tuition fees may be full or partial, depending on our criteria. Please note that the scholarship does not cover the expenses for fieldwork and thesis writing during the last (fourth) quarter. The recipient of the scholarship will be notified of the result at the same time as the admission offer.

The scholarship covers living expenses and other related costs.
